Eligibility:

1. **WorkSafe Saskatchewan** and the *Saskatchewan Workers Compensation Board* are inviting high school students to create a video in any style that tells their friends about workplace health and safety. To be eligible, your video must be no longer than 5 minutes in length.
2. The contest is open to all grade nine to twelve students. Submissions can be made individually or as a team. Each contestant may only enter one original submission, either individually or as part of a team effort.
3. Each contestant must certify on the entry form that the video submission is an original work by the contestant or his/her team and must grant **WorkSafe Saskatchewan** unrestricted use and reproduction rights for any purpose.
4. Your video must be entirely your (or in the case of a team effort, your team's) own original creation. It must not infringe upon or violate any laws or any third party rights, including, but not limited to, copyright, patent, trademark, trade secret or other proprietary rights and must not lead to any cause of action including libel, defamation, privacy violation, contract breach or tort. Contestants must obtain all necessary permissions, licenses, clearances, releases, waivers of moral rights and other approvals from third parties (including but not limited to all copyright holders and all individuals appearing in the video submission), necessary to use the video submission, in whole or in part, in any way, including without limitation, to reproduce, make derivatives, edit, modify, translate, distribute, transmit, publish, license and broadcast the video submission worldwide, by any means. Any and all such permissions, licenses, clearances, releases, waivers of moral rights and approvals must be attached with your video entry.

General Information:

5. Your own personal safety and the safety of your cast, crew and others involved with the production of the video submission is of the utmost importance and must be maintained. Do not endanger anyone during the making of your video. If you are on a work site, take all appropriate health and safety precautions including without limitation following all applicable health and safety policies and regulations. It is advisable to consult with a supervisor at the site to obtain this information. 6. No entries will be returned. All winning entries become the sole property of **WorkSafe Saskatchewan** and *Saskatchewan Workers' Compensation Board*.



7. Prizes will be awarded to the top three submissions in each category. The school of each winning submission will receive a matching cash prize. Please see the following table for prize distribution

8. If a contestant is not 18 years old, *WorkSafe Saskatchewan* and *Saskatchewan Workers' Compensation Board* will require his or her parent's or legal guardian's authorization before permitting the contestant to participate in the contest and accept a prize as awarded. In the case of a team effort, each member of the team who is not 18 years old must also obtain parental or guardian consent.
9. When entering this contest, each contestant (and where appropriate, with the consent of a parent or guardian) must consent to the use, reproduction, publication, transmission and/or broadcasting of his/her name, address, likeness, school, age, grade and/or prize information, without compensation, in any *WorkSafe Saskatchewan* or *Saskatchewan Workers' Compensation Board* advertisement, publication or promotion, for general news or other information purposes. Winners must also consent to their photographs being taken by *WorkSafe Saskatchewan* for the same purposes, without further compensation. Each contestant (and where required, his/her parent or guardian) irrevocably and in perpetuity grants *WorkSafe Saskatchewan* and *Saskatchewan Workers' Compensation Board*, without compensation, the right to use the video submission, in whole or in part, in any way, including without limitation, to reproduce, make derivatives, edit, modify, translate, distribute, transmit, publish, license and broadcast the video submission worldwide, by any means.
10. The chances of winning a prize depend on the total number and quality of eligible entries received prior to the closing date.
11. *WorkSafe Saskatchewan* or *Saskatchewan Workers' Compensation Board* reserves the right to cancel, terminate, modify or suspend the contest for any reason, without any prior notice to any contestant.

Selection of Awards:



12. In the case of a team effort, *WorkSafe Saskatchewan* may issue pro-rated cheque(s) to each team member. Each high school, of a winning student or team, will also receive a cash prize.

13. Entries will be judged by a panel of judges chosen by *WorkSafe Saskatchewan*. The decisions of the judges on all matters relating to the contest are final and not open to dispute. Judging will be based on the 2010 *WorkSafe Saskatchewan* Student Video Contest Judging Criteria.

14. The teachers whose students submit the winning entries will be notified that one of their students or teams has a winning submission. The teacher will in turn notify the individual, team or class. An awards ceremony will be held at the 2010 Compensation Institute, held in Regina in March of 2010, and the first, second and third prizes in each category will be announced. If an individual or one or more team members decline the prize, the prize may be forfeited and awarded to another entry in accordance with these contest rules.

15. If *WorkSafe Saskatchewan* does not receive entries of sufficient quantity or quality, *Work Safe Saskatchewan* reserves the right not to award any prizes.

Entry Information:

16. Each contestant or team may only submit one video submission in either VHS or DVD-R format. Multiple entries will not be accepted.

17. Your video submission must be received by *WorkSafe Saskatchewan* by 4:00 pm on Friday, February 19, 2010.

19. The video entry must be clearly labeled with your video's title, your name, mailing address and telephone number. Where more than one student has been involved in the creation of the video, the video entry must be clearly labeled as a team effort.

20. Include your completed Official Entry Form with your video submission. If the entry is a team effort, please ensure that all team members have filled out an



official entry form. PLEASE SEND *WORKSAFE SASKATCHEWAN* A DUPLICATE COPY OF YOUR VIDEO. DO NOT SEND IN YOUR ONLY COPY.

21. If you require confirmation that *WorkSafe Saskatchewan* has received and accepted your entry, include your e-mail address on the completed entry form. *WorkSafe Saskatchewan* will try to advise you that your entry was received.

22. For the purpose of these rules, each properly labeled video submission, accompanied by properly completed Official Entry Forms and Teacher and Student Evaluation Forms, shall be considered a valid entry. **All entries must meet the criteria outlined in the checklist.**

23. These rules may be changed without notice or reason including, if necessary, to comply with any applicable law. By entering this contest, contestants agree to abide by these rules and acknowledge that *WorkSafe Saskatchewan* and *Saskatchewan Workers' Compensation Board* shall not be responsible for any damages, costs, demands, claims or losses of any kind, incurred by any contestant as a result of participation in *WorkSafe Saskatchewan's* Student Video Contest.

24. This contest shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Province of Saskatchewan and any applicable federal laws. These rules govern all aspects of the contest and are binding on all judges and contestants, and all other participants including parents, legal guardians and team members, who sign the Official Entry Form.
