Annual reporting		
The Employer's Payroll Statement (EPS) must be completed every year by Feb. 28 for eactive account, regardless of type of coverage, including accounts with only optional per coverage. Your EPS is to report actual wages for the previous year and to estimate wag the upcoming year If you are no longer operating, you must close your account during the process. Penalties will apply if your EPS is received late.		
You must report the wages for all of your Saskatchewan workers, including directors on T4. Assessable earnings are capped at a maximum amount, which is indicated on the EPS. If you've requested clearances on your contractors throughout the year, they will be shown on your EPS. If any are missing, or if any of the amounts are lower than what you've paid out, you must include the contractors on your EPS, including a description of the work they've done. The EPS is available to customers online starting in January every year. A letter is mailed out to remind customers to complete the EPS before the deadline. Make sure your address and other contact information is up to date so you do not miss these important reminders.
