



## Solution

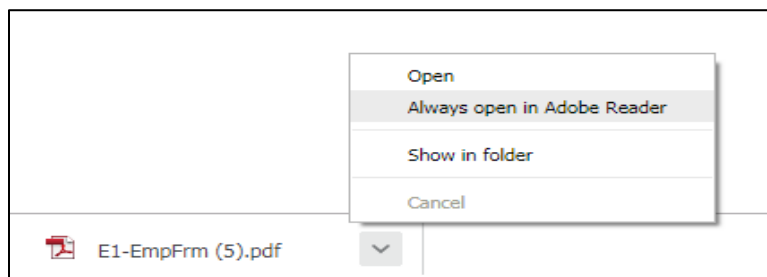
Perform the following steps to configure Firefox and Chrome to open PDFs using Adobe Reader or Adobe Acrobat.

### Note:


*Ensure that you have Adobe Reader or Adobe Acrobat installed on your machine.*

## Configure Chrome

1. Open Google Chrome.
2. Click on the **Menu** icon  in the top-right corner of the Window.
3. Click **Settings**.
4. Scroll down to the bottom of the Settings window and click  button.
5. In the *Privacy and security* section, click **Content Settings**.
6. Scroll down and click the **PDF documents** option.
7. Change the "Download PDF files instead of automatically opening them in Chrome" option from the off position (grey) to the on position (blue).
8. When the PDF link is clicked, the PDF file is downloaded and the PDF filename appears in the bottom-left corner of the Window. Click on the arrow and select *Always open in Adobe Reader*.



## Configure Firefox

1. Open Firefox.
2. Click the menu  button on the top-right corner and select **Options**.
3. In the **Options** window, click **Applications**.

4. Under the **Content type** column, select the **Portable Document Format (PDF)** option.
5. In the **Action** column, click the down arrow on the right side of the box.
6. In the drop-down menu that appears, select **Use other...**
7. In the window that appears, choose **Use Adobe Reader** from the list.
8. Click **OK**.
