The purpose of this checklist is to help you understand if you are meeting your responsibilities as an employer according to The Workers' Compensation Act, 2013. You do not need to submit this form to Saskatchewan Workers' Compensation Board (WCB), it is intended to be a self- evaluation tool for employers.

Annual reporting		
The Employer's Payroll Statement (EPS) must be completed every year by Feb. 28 for every		
active account, including accounts with only optional personal coverage. Your EPS is to report		
actual wages for the previous year and to estimate wages for the upcoming year. If you are no		
longer operating, you must close your account during this process. Penalties will apply if your		
EPS is received late.
